

Rev. Dr. Mathew Hunter, Jr., DMin.

A native of Bessemer, Alabama, Reverend Hunter is the third of five children born to the Late Deacon Mathew Sr. and Bessie Hunter. Reverend Hunter is a graduate of Jess Lanier High School. He also is a graduate of Lawson State College of Bessemer (formerly known as Bessemer State Technical College).
